Room 7B: °'°KOBI: Navigating the Universe of Knowledge

Room 5A: Tessela

Tessela is a generative multimedia installation that takes shape from a common seed: a shared dialogue with °'°Kobi. Four divergent trajectories are grafted onto a shared origin, giving life to autonomous and interdependent fragments. Sounds, images and words compose and disintegrate according to non-linear logics. As in non-periodic tessellations, each element fits together without repeating itself, evoking an expanding landscape, an unstable constellation. A collective gesture that deviates, returns, gets lost without seeking closure.

Room 8B: Enacting / Revealing Artistic Research

The understanding of a work of art relies on the reactivation of its creative processes, which can be reconstructed from within through non-invasive diagnostics. These spectroscopic imaging techniques provide increasingly accurate information: from the pigments employed to the underdrawing beneath the paint layer, from experiments with materials and techniques to the virtual reconstruction of the sequence of chromatic layers.
