Room 5A: Tessela

Tessela is a generative multimedia installation that takes shape from a common seed: a shared dialogue with °'°Kobi. Four divergent trajectories are grafted onto a shared origin, giving life to autonomous and interdependent fragments. Sounds, images and words compose and disintegrate according to non-linear logics. As in non-periodic tessellations, each element fits together without repeating itself, evoking an expanding landscape, an unstable constellation. A collective gesture that deviates, returns, gets lost-without seeking closure.

Room 8B: Enacting / Revealing Artistic Research

The understanding of a work of art relies on the reactivation of its creative processes, which can be reconstructed from within through non-invasive diagnostics. These spectroscopic imaging techniques provide increasingly accurate information: from the pigments employed to the underdrawing beneath the paint layer, from experiments with materials and techniques to the virtual reconstruction of the sequence of chromatic layers. During the roundtable, highlights of the research carried out within EAR Work Package 2-Art | Cultural Heritage and Science: Cross-Fertilization, will be discussed.
