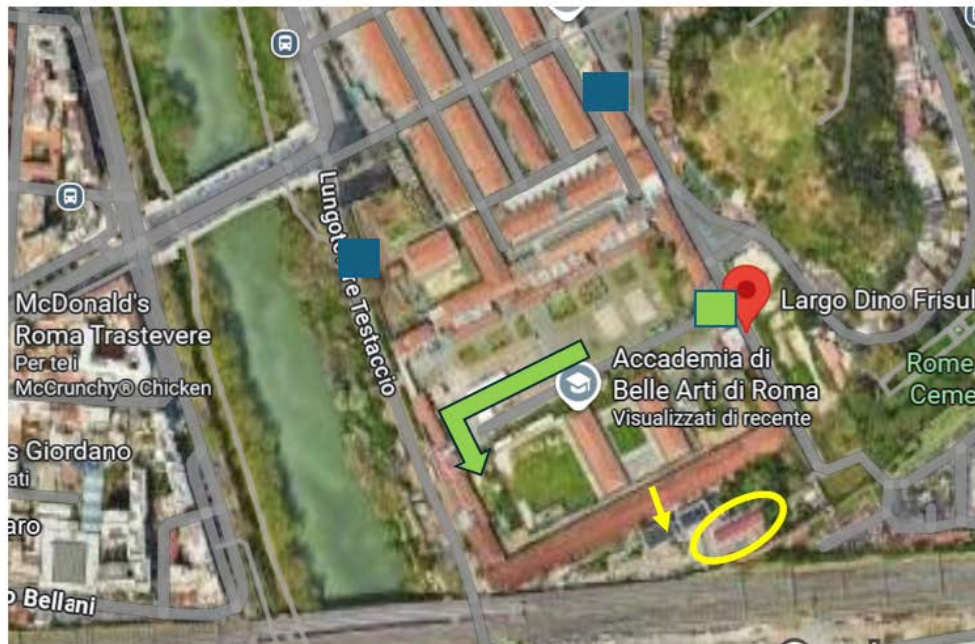
Welcome to Rome and to the COST Action meeting!

Venue

The Fine Arts Academy of Rome has two main campuses. The COST Action meeting and the activities organized for the "European Researchers' Night" will take place at the Campo Boario campus, located in Largo Dino Frisullo, in the heart of the vibrant Testaccio district.

The campus is inside the former slaughterhouse, which is being transformed into a "Città delle Arti", already hosting Universities, Theaters and Festivals

Hotels

Public Transports

How to reach Largo Dino Frisullo (Testaccio campus)

- **By Metro:** Take **Line B** and get off at **Piramide station**. From there it's about a **10-minute walk** to Largo Dino Frisullo.
- **By Train:** Get off at **Ostiense station** (regional trains). The campus is within a **10-minute walk**.
- **By Bus:** Several bus lines stop nearby, including **170, 719, 83**

Food & Drinks

*We are working to provide you with some delicious coffee breaks during the intensive sessions, and if everything goes as planned, they will be available in the courtyard of the venue. If not, just a 5-minute walk from Largo Dino Frisullo, you will find **the historical Testaccio Market**, where it is possible to buy food, drinks, and a wide variety of local products. Inside the market, several stalls offer take-away options as well as seating areas to enjoy your meal on site. In addition, the surrounding area is full of restaurants serving authentic traditional Roman cuisine.*
